APRIL 1990 35 YEARS AGO

Our Club must have been getting big, because our newest member's family was from England! The Westgate's owned two 1930 Tudors, out of England's total number of As of approximately 100. Owners of unique vehicles would no longer have to struggle with hard starting, yellowish, dim headlights, or dead batteries! Fifth Avenue Antique Auto Parts in Kansas had developed a six volt alternator. It had an output rating of 60 amps and 7.5 volts and a simple two wire hookup for ease of installation.

APRIL 2000 25 YEARS AGO

Jack Stokinger announced he would be placing an order of the new 6 volt alternators soon. The price was \$60 plus \$5 for shipping. Wow! Today's price for purchasing the 6 volt alternator is \$160!

APRIL 2010 15 YEARS AGO

The 2010 Tour Card was at the printer shop and was scheduled to be available for inclusion with the April Oil Leak and at the April Meeting on the 6th. Over 60 tours had been scheduled for the summer months. The Spring Tour Clinic had been scheduled to take place at Jack and Jo's home in Sudbury. Space was limited, so you needed to make an appointment for your Model A. Experts would check out your Model A and identify areas that needed attention. Most repairs could be made on site.

around 7:30 AM. Why not join us there is always room for you.




THE MODEL A WHEEL BEARING



One area that always seems to cause confusion is how tight the spindle nut should be when servicing the front wheel bearings. Greasing them at proper intervals is important and so is the proper load on the bearing. The Model A Service Bulletins says the following: "Adjusting Front Wheel Bearing: If there is excessive play in the bearing it can be adjusted as follows: Remove the cotter key and tighten the adjusting nut until the hub just starts to bind. Then back off one or two notches until the hub can be freely revolved." The key is to set the bearing in the race and not having the bearing too tight. More bearings are ruined from being too tight

than from being loose. The more times you do this it becomes something you can feel when it's right.

Nan Linden reported that we had one new member:


Thomas Doward of Keene, NH who has a 1946 Plymouth.



Apríl 1775–2025

Paul Revere's midnight ride was an alert given to minutemen in the Province of Massachusetts Bay by local Patriots on the night of April 18, 1775, warning them of the approach of British Army troops prior to the battles of Lexington and Concord. Sons of Liberty members Paul Revere and William Dawes prepared the alert, which used a lantern signal from the Old North Church to warn colonists of the British Army's advance by way of the Charles River. Revere and Dawes then rode to meet John Hancock and Samuel Adams in Lexington, ten miles away. Continuing on to Concord the British met the Minutemen at the North Bridge who fired upon them and the British retreated.



Although the skirmish only lasted a few seconds, "The shot was heard around the World!"



As part of the 2025 New England Meet schedule a tour to the historic Old North Bridge is planned. In addition to history around Old North Bridge, which has been fixed/replaced 8 times since the battle, a visit to the North Bridge Visitor Center museum is a great place to learn more of the events surrounding the April 19, 1775 battle. We look forward to sharing our historical area with our visitors during the NE Meet.

Jim's Tech Tip - Clutch Free Play



Clutch Pedal Free Play It is easy to forget to check the Clutch Pedal Clearance (or Free Play) now and then, but you really do need to check it. I press down gently on the pedal with just a couple of fingers, to judge how far down the pedal goes before you are pressing the throwout bearing against the clutch "fingers". If you do not have an inch of movement, follow the instructions below. A little extra free play will not hurt anything.

Clutch Pedal Clearence

The Correct clearance or play for the clutch pedal is approximately 1". That is when the clutch pedal is de-

pressed there should be about 1" of movement in the pedal before it starts to disengage the clutch.

As the clutch facings wear this clearance or movement gradually grows less. Consequently it should occasionally be checked. Under no circumstances should the car be driven without clearance or play in the clutch pedal.

Adjusting Clutch Pedal Clearence

The adjustment is easily made by removing the clevis pin (A) and turning the release arm rod (B). Screwing the in decreases the clutch pedal play. Screwing the rod out increases the play. After making adjustment, be sure to replace the clevis pin and cotter key.

Forgetting to keep an inch or so of clutch pedal free play can lead to premature throw-out bearing failure, because the bearing is spinning all the time where the pedal is pressing it into the clutch. We don't want that. So maybe check it every time you change the oil and adjust as required.


MAFFI Sweepstakes

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
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April Meeting News
