Summer has its ups and downs. I love being outside but when it gets in the high 90's it sure is a lot easier to just stay inside - I don't know why!!



## THE MUNSON ROAD TEST

Many moons ago while working on some computer gear to be installed in a military vehicle, I learned of the Munson Road Test. It is a road full of obstacles at the Aberdeen Military Proving Grounds. Now Franklin NH has a similar couple of like roads that I travel daily. Munson shakes out military vehicle problems, Franklin continues to shake out, indeed encourage, rattles and bangs in my "A".

It's been a while since I've written anything so I'll play a little catch up .

Just mounted that noise and heat baffle. That project made me clean up some wiring issues. This baffle is really great from my prospective. It fit easily and looks good and covers up a lot of rough looking firewall. And it really does work. I am pleased with the sound reduction and will miss the warmth this fall. Wish I had purchased it (and a lot of other stuff) before the big price increases. So I give it a thumbs up, especially if you are a daily driver.

The Munson test proved Snyder's comment about cheap bumper clamps. Bang and off dropped one side of my front bumper. Thought it was my muffler! All that was left of the clamp was the bolt! The top of the other one also broke off. Time to change that Canadian center clamp.

There are now some 5 K miles on my engine with insert bearings. There is just a feeling of confidence, knowing I won't have to take up the mains and rods. I plug along at 50-55 every day (not in Franklin). The counter balanced crank has cut vibrations on this old design 4 banger. I wish that I had waited for that new Burtz engine. Reports on it are great. But the A's 91 and I'm 90 so I'll get my payback.

I put radial tires on but think it was a mistake. They are OK on the road but for me, especially with shoulder issues, just simple turns are a real chore. I'm not sure I'm getting decent mileage out of them.

The new LED headlights are really great! DO IT. I've got LED tails ready to mount. Much brighter. The bar stop light in my rear window was also good move.

And do I love my Mitchel overdrive! You know, I think I gonna keep this car! If you are more than a short haul weekender, this is a really good move.

And of course my electronic distributor kit. No more burnt points, always adjusting, no shaft & bushings wear, failing condenser.

More on my list and I still have a "to do" list (always). But I need to segway to my needs list. Right now, just need a 30-31 trunk or rumble lid (*real bad*).



## **Model A Fuel Line**

SWEAT SOLDER TO TUBE ----

This diagram is taken from original Model A blueprints and it shows how the ferrule is added to the fuel line. It shows two important things: First is the spacing of the ferrule from the end of the gas line. This is important as if makes sure the fuel to the carburetor is not restricted. And Second it also shows that the ferrule was soldered to the fuel line. This was most likely to guarantee the 3/32" spacing for the ferrule is maintained.






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
