**Sept 6:** 9:00 AM This will be a unique tour to the USS Constitution at the Charlestown Naval base. You must have completed the sigh up form to attend.


## Flea Market Help

#### Minutes of the Minuteman Model A Ford Club July 2, 2025

**President: Harold Samuels** gaveled the meeting open at 7:30 PM to an attendance of 28 people. He then led in the pledge of allegiance to the flag. The Secretary's report and the Treasurer's report were accepted as printed in the Oil Leak.

**Vice President:** McLaughlin was on vacation so there was no report from him.

**Membership Chair**: Nan Linden, reported that there were no new members this month.

**Tour Chair**: Don Ross, was absent but sent his report to President Harold. Don reported that the month of June was busy and thanked Doug Linden for posting pictures of the national tour in the newsletter. He reported that the Ross's, the Lindens and Marshalls attended the national tour, and the bad weather was a factor and the tours were several hundred miles.

Also, Rich Batstone is arranging a Hubley Derby for the meet. It was reported that taking an ad in the program would help with the income of the meet.

**Local News:** Ron West reported on the Waltham Museum saying they have a donation of beautiful 1911 Metz and September 20 would be Metz day in Waltham.

#### New meaning to the term "oil leak"




At a recent breakfast meeting I placed some cardboard under my Coupe engine area to see how badly a new leak had reared it's ugly head. I assumed it was a rear main seal leak and it was very bad (some of you saw the leak on the cardboard container). I phoned Harold Legge to see if I could put my car on his lift to help analyze what was wrong. He asked a couple of questions and gave me something to try in order to begin checking things out. He suggested I secure a plastic bag tightly to my uncapped oil filler pipe to see if the bag would inflate when I ran the engine. It did, but only a little bit. BUT, more importantly, when I took the filler cap off and looked into the filler pipe I noticed it was fully clogged with a gooey sort of fluffy yellow orange substance (very gross). I had never seen anything like this before so I called Harold again to tell him about it. I was totally surprised when he told me that the same thing happens to his Model A about once every year or two. He suggested that I remove the filler pipe and clean it out. Harold said it might solve the problem. When I put it back together, sure enough the oil leak

stopped! So, it might be smart to check that filler pipe for any clogging from time to time on your cars. We don't know why this happens but it may have something to do with the intense heat and humidity we have had recently. Thanks Harold, you are a genius!




