



## **Secretary's Report**

#### Minutes of the Minuteman Model A Ford Club November 5, 2025

Ball Joints - End Plug Adjustment

Measure free length of the spring

Assemble the parts into tie rod ends
 or steering drag link ends

 Screw the plug in slowly until it just starts to compress the spring

This is zero spring compression

 Screw plug in further until its insertion depth is 25% of spring dimension & loosen to align cotter pin

 Plug adjustments, joint parts replacement & ball replacements necessitate front wheel toe-in adjustment




