2023 Officer Installation





Pat Callan 1938–2023



INVENTIONS DURING THE MODEL A ERA ***1928***



SCOTCH TAPE: We all have used scotch tape brand of tape since we were kids. But do you know the story behind this product? The 3M company introduced the Scotch Tape brand in 1928. The inspiration for this product came to engineer Richard Drew from watching auto engineers trying to achieve a smooth painting on two-color car (I wonder if he visited a Ford plant?) The original solution was masking tape that later evolved to a transparent product. The sales of the product took off during the depression as it provided a way to mend household items like books,

clothing, and curtains. Although it is a trademark and a brand name, Scotch tape is sometimes used as a generic term.



SLICED BREAD: Who hasn't heard the expression "The Greatest Thing Since Sliced Bread?" Well sliced bread wasn't readily available until 1928 when the first automatically sliced commercial loaves were first produced on July 6, 1928, in Chillicothe, Missouri, using the machine invented by Otto Rohwedder, an Iowa-born Missouri based jeweler. When it first appeared the bread was advertised as "the greatest forward step in the baking industry since bread was wrapped". From that tag line developed today's phrase "the greatest thing since sliced bread" which is a commonly used syntagm as a hyperbolic way of praising an invention or development. Which probably says how much was sliced bread loved when it first appeared.

Oh! to answer your question, the first commercial baking company to sell sliced bread was... Wonder Bread in 1930. The A&P ad was from 1932.

Womens Winter Boots

In some parts of the country, the snow is flying and the trusty galoshes may not be enough to protect your feet from the winter weather. Thankfully, in the Model A era, there were multiple, fashionable, boot styles from which to choose, some of which are shown here.

High Cut Boot

This sporty 15-inch high cut boot features a handy side pocket. The soles are genuine Goodyear Welt* leather. The heel is topped with rubber. The available colors are brown and black, in sizes 2 ½ to 8 in a wide width. The sale price is \$4.79.

National Bellas Hess, Winter, 1931-32



*The Goodyear Welt is a method of stitching the upper and sole of the shoe together, resulting in the unique positioning of the two seams in the shoe bottom. A hidden seam holds together the welt, the upper, the lining and the insole of the shoe. It is stitched using a Goodyear Welt Machine.

Jim's Tech Tip

Starter Ground

I've had several people ask me why their starter seems to crank the engine over rather slowly. For the most part, this is because that's what our starters do, they did not spin as fast as on a modern car. So there is nothing wrong.

However, I will mention that you need to make sure that the starter has a really good ground when you mount it to the flywheel housing. Fresh paint on the engine combined with fresh paint on a newly rebuilt starter can result in you not having a very good ground connection between starter and engine. Over time you can also get a buildup of rust on the

mounting surfaces, or a film of oil and dirt accumulation that interferes with the ground.

So if you think your starter is cranking a bit slowly, it would not hurt to pull it off, clean up the mounting surfaces with a degreaser followed by some fine sandpaper, and reinstall it. See if that gets it turning at a better speed again.




