Jim True presented a financial report for our National Meet in Sturbridge in 1988. The club then had access to \$15,160.89 resulting from that Meet and had an opportunity to build a club library of books and videos ,etc. We could reach out to the community by way of a tool scholarship, a permanent club library and a donation to the Girl Scout Camp Virginia, by motion, seconded, and passed in the amount of \$2,850.00.

FEBRUARY 1999 25 YEARS AGO

It was decided that our Annual Minuteman Swap Meet would be held on March 21st at Acton Ford and that 155 letters would be sent out to interested vendors, clubs, etc. A big thank you was extended to Shelly Boucher for getting our club online. The website address was posted in the January Oil Leak for all interested surfers. MAFCA had agreed to donate up to three \$4,000.00 grants to schools who have teenagers willing to restore a Model A. House Bill 4785, the Massachusetts bill which permitted you to insure your collector car at collector rates, had passed and been signed by the Governor.

FEBRUARÝ 2009 15 YEARS AGO

A vote to approve the newly revised by-laws were ready. There was a plan to have a discussion on these new changes before the vote. John Jacobson passed the gavel at the January meeting to Jack Stokinger as the new year's incoming Club President. FYI although the appearance of the various Model A dip sticks are different, they actually measure the oil in the pan exactly same.

"FAN" TASTIC

OK, when was the last time you thought of the fan on the Model A? Probably not recently for sure. The fan however can be the source of some serious problems for both the Model A and YOU. The Model A fan is shaped like a propellor fan did let go while on a tour and seriously damand draws a large amount of air through the radiator at idle and low speeds. It's construction was made out of two pieces of pressed steel that are then welded together to form the fan. The problem is that over the years these fans are susceptible to fatigue cracks which will eventually cause the fan to fly apart. And likely at the most inopportune time. Fortunately not many of us are still using original fans as these can cause damage to your radiator, hood and even personal injury if you happen to have your head under the hood. We are fortunate that an exact copy of the fan is now available. It's made out of cast aluminum

cracks

and is what you should be using on your Model A. There are 4-blade fans that are also used and they are subject to the same fatigue and also should not be used. I can say that my original aged my radiator and put a small dent on the side of the hood. Others have not been so lucky as the broken blade went right the hood. In another instance were on tour and a member could hear an unusual sound. At the next rest stop we took a look and were amazed to see the fan had partially broken and was rubbing on the radiator. We continued the tour by breaking off both blades of the fan. Needless to say this disaster was avoided just in time. If you still have an original 2-blade or 4-blade fan please replace it while the Model A's are resting in the garage for the winter.

As you can see from the above pictures cracks in the fan can be obvious and some not so. Harold Samuels can attest to how close to disaster he was do to a bad fan/ The new aluminum fans are the way to go.

During the disassembly something unusual caught his eye, the float valve looked different, Yes, the ball in the float valve was made of glass. This float valve look very similar to the Grose Jet valve that was right here in Stoneham, MA, but instead of a steel ball this was glass. We held the valve up to a light and sure enough you could see the light right through it. It was indeed glass and not an optical illusion.. Chris had no idea how long that valve was in the carb, but it worked. A search on the internet did not produce any information on this type of valve. So we will have keep searching.

The Raffle is Back




