


Happy Father's Day

If O'Bee has just one of these originals, it's worth more than his whole drawer full.







Minuteman Club Tour Clinic

Our Tour Clinic was a great success. Thanks to the hospitality of Harold and Sally Legge for providing the venue for our gathering we were able to check out 13 Model A's. The primary areas that we seem to find problems are Steering and Headlights. This year we checked out the differences between the new LED headlight bulbs and original. Our tests showed that only the original headlights would focus per the Ford Service bulletins. The older version LEDs could not be focused per the specification, however the new LED bulbs did at least show a High and Low beam difference, but still no discernable pattern on the test board. The LED bulbs do broadcast a lot of light but keeping the beam on the road and out of oncoming drivers eyes still needs work. Steering issues varied, some loose Pitman arms and toe-in problems were corrected. Unfortunately some steering boxes had more complicated problems that would require removal and rebuilding to correct them.

One Model A that showed up was so nice that it required nothing, the only comment on that cars report was "Excellent Car."

Thanks to all the "mechanics" for lending their expertise and to the members for bringing their Model A's to checked out for roadworthiness for the upcoming touring season.



Delivering The Telephone Truck

The Model A Ford Foundation Inc. (MAFFI) recently purchased a beautifully restored Telephone Truck that was listed for sale and owned by Fred & Diana Taranto from Hopkinton. I was asked to inspect the truck which was garaged in Waltham at home of his brother Bill who just happens to be a Minuteman Club member. The truck lived up to its description and more so. The Museum made an offer which Fred & Diana accepted and the deal was done. Once all the paper work was completed the next step was to arrange for its transportation to the museum in Michigan. As all this was taking place, club member Dave Libbey was searching for a Slant Windshield Fordor sedan. The search lead him to Ohio and where he was able to purchase one that met his requirements. Dave contacted the museum staff and they reached an agreement for transporting the telephone truck to MI which then allowed Dave to pick up his "new" Fordor on the return trip. I offered to ride along and that resulted in a 2000 mile three day Road Trip.





Jim's Tech Tips "Grease Fitting Added to 7-tooth Steering Gear"

The Ford Service Bulletin from September, 1928, has a brief mention of adding a grease fitting to the sector shaft housing of the 7-tooth steering gear. Today's Tech Tip is a reprint of that little article from that bulletin.

NEW LUBRICATOR FITTING IN STEERING GEAR HOUSING

The drilled hole in the steering sector shaft, through which the lubricant in the steering gear housing was carried to the sector shaft bushings, has been discontinued. Sector shaft bushings are now lubricated by means of a lubricator fitting placed in the steering gear housing. (See A, Fig. 570.) Lubricant should be forced into this fitting every 2,000 miles.

Should an instance arise where it is necessary to install the present design sector in an old steering gear assembly, it will be necessary to install a lubricator fitting in the housing. This is done by drilling a 21/64'' hole 2-3/32'' back from center line of flange where housing is bolted to frame. (See Fig. 571.) The hole should be drilled through housing and sector bushing and then tapped with a standard 1/8'' pipe tap. When tapping the hole, do not tap too deep. The hole should be tapped just deep enough so that when the lubricator fitting is screwed down tightly approximately two threads on the fitting will remain above the surface of the housing. (See Fig. 571.)



You fill the steering gear box with the very heavy and thick 600W oil, and you squirt a little grease into this fitting that you are adding. The grease will lubricate the sector shaft, and it will form a little bit of a barrier that will slow down (not stop) the 600W gear oil from seeping out the sector shaft.



As you can see 600w oil is used in this steering box even though a grease fitting is used in on the housing.


