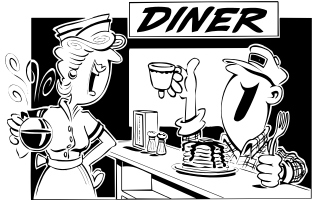

There was no old business.

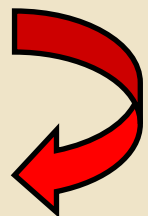
Refreshments for the next meeting will be brought by Dennis Porter and Harold Legge.

The most common causes of front end shimmy

The most common causes of front end shimmy which is sometimes referred to as death wobble. Now that will make you think. The most common causes of this are:

- worn spindle bolts (king pins),
- worn steering sector in the gear box,
- out of round brake drums,
- loose front radius rod and ball at the bell housing,
- worn or loose drag link and tie rod ends in the steering linkage.



Some other causes can be loose wheel bearings, excessive caster, camber, or toe, loose spring u bolts, wheels out of balance, under inflated tires, sagging or broken spring or loose steering gearbox adjustment.

A thorough inspection needs to be done since any of these can cause the shimmy but often a combination of more than one item will be found during the inspection.

National Club News

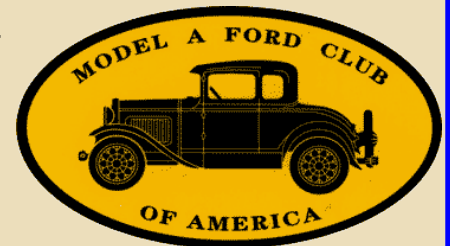

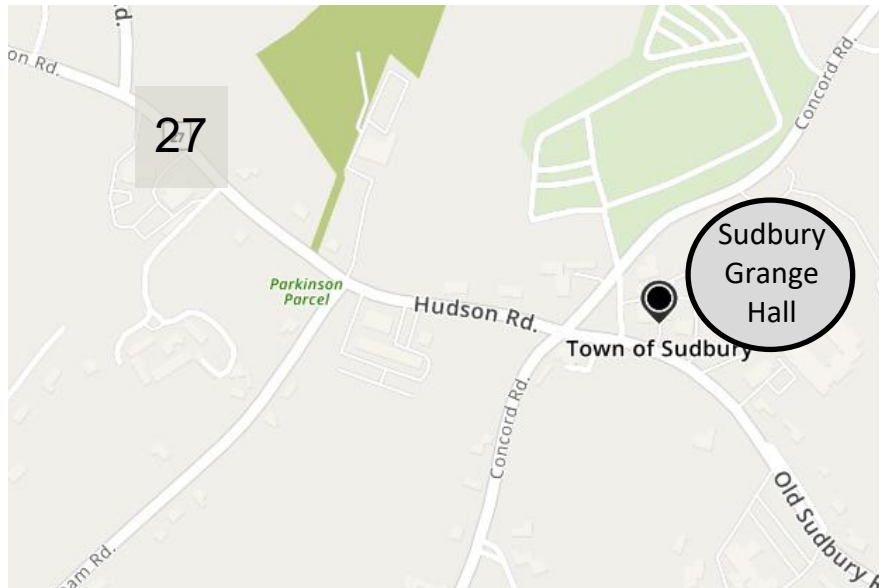
