The President Speaks:


March is upon us and I hope everyone is in good health and trying to enjoy the cold days. Spring is almost here.



National News:


-Doug Linden talked about the MARC Convention in Morgantown, PA. The host hotel is full but there are many other hotels in a 10-mile radius.

Tire Chain History - August 23, 1904

Harry D. Weed of Canastota, New York, was issued U.S. Patent Number 768,495 for his "Grip-Tread for Pneumatic Tires," an innovation designed to help make driving safer in inclement winter weather or similarly adverse muddy road conditions. According to one of his great-grandsons, Weed came up with the idea for creating tire chains after seeing drivers wrap ropes and in some cases even vines around tires to increase traction on muddy, snowy, or icy roads.

Weed, who was working at the time for a Canastota-based machine shop that made such products as automobile engines, sought to develop a non-skid traction device that would be more durable in harsh driving conditions. He explained that his invention was meant to "provide a flexible and collapsible grip or tread composed entirely of chains linked together and applied to the sides and periphery of the tire and held in place solely by the

inflation of the tire, and which is reversible." The tire chain was wrapped around a partially deflated tire that could then be refilled with air after the hooks on either end of the tire chain were fastened.

In the same year in which he received his patent for the world's first tire chain, Weed established his own company to manufacture and sell the product. Over the next several years, the Weed Chain Tire Grip Company thrived as its tire chains steadily grew in popularity. In 1912, Weed sold both his patent and company to the American Chain and Cable Company in Detroit. He died in 1961 at the age of 89. (from; www.transportationhistory.org)

I remember stories the guys I worked with at the phone company telling about them weaving rope through and around the tires as make-shift chains to make it home during storms back when Model A's were daily drivers. Chains were used on Model A's for years and many a rear fender has the scars to prove it. The area of the rear fender where it attaches to the running board usually has some damage from flapping broken links. Of course back in the day that wasn't a concern. *#There is a good article on Model A Chains in the Jan/Feb 2010 issue of The Restorer magazine.*





If you were wondering how to determine the rear end gear ratio of the your Model A is this Tiny Tip from a past issue of The Restorer magazine will easily let you figured out the ratio. Most Model A's have 3.78:1 but not all, just ask Jack.


HOW TO DETERMINE YOUR REAR END RATIO

Here's one way to find out the ring and pinion ratio in your Model A. Park on a flat surface with several feet of clear space in front. Remove all four spark plus. Put a chalk mark on a rear tire at 6

o'clock as shown. Mark the front of the crank pulley at 12 o'clock. With the help of a friend, and the transmission in high gear, push the vehicle forward and watch the mark on the crank pulley. Count the number of times the mark on the pulley reaches 12



o'clock and stop when the tire mark is at 6 o'clock again. Note the position of the mark on the crank pulley. The mark you made will be at approximately the area of your gear ratio as shown.






