Nashoba ValleyTech Senior Project

The Minuteman club was recently contacted by Mr. Brian Fillion, instructor of the Advanced Manufacturing Department of Nashoba Valley Technical High School. Brian was looking for some expertise to help him guide his Senior students as they embarked on a project to rebuild a Model A engine as their Senior Project. Brian was hoping member/s would be able to answer questions and give him some insight on the project. Jack Stokinger and Doug Linden met with Brian and the students on our first visit and provided them with Les Andrews Model A Mechanics book as well as some parts catalogs. We also advised them on which of the two engine blocks to use and answer some general questions. On our next visit Dick Stitt, Len Michalak and Doug Linden came prepared to help out by donating some larger missing parts (Generator and Starter). We also found out that, although the Project was approved by the school, no funds were available for the project and that Brian was footing the bill out of his own pocket. It was then the club stepped up and decided to help. After all, what better way could we find to encourage the youth to get interested in the Model A hobby. We made a detailed list of all the parts needed to finish the project and went to Tam's buy them, which amounted to just over \$200. Thanks to other members, all the remaining parts were donated. Our third trip to the school was to bring the treasure trove of parts to the eager kids. Brian was anxious to get the kids to work on rebuilding the distributor and carburetor. We also went over plans for attaching the radiator, and a small dash board for the ignition switch, coil, ammeter and the gas tank. Brian was going to mount the small gas tank on the engine stand, that is until we told him it was a gravity feed system and had to mounted higher than the carburetor. Oops! A small fact that non-Model Aers aren't familiar with. Other shops at the school are also involved. The Carpentry Shop made the engine stand frame, the Body Shop painted the engine and it's parts. The last important part is the muffler, we aren't sure who's going to make that critical item. We can't wait to go back and help them get the engine started. Stay tuned for that report.
