This past September the New England Regional Meet was hosted by the MARCOM chapter and held at the Envision Hotel located in Mansfield, Mass. Several Minuteman members attended and enjoyed all the planned activities MARCOM had provided. The weather was perfect and the bonus of seeing World War I airplane demonstrations held by the Collings Foundation was an added delight.

For our newer club members, a little background history is in order regarding the new England regional meets. This annual event is hosted by several clubs on a rotational basis. Clubs involved in the past were: Adirondack NY, Long Island NY, Western Mass, Minuteman, CMARC Connecticut, MARCOM, Little Rhody, Pine Tree A's, The Lakes region New Hampshire. The hosting chapter is responsible for providing the host hotel, hospitality, registration, raffles, dinners, grand tour for judging cars, programs, repair tent, etc.

The Minuteman club has hosted the regional three times in the past. Representatives from all clubs meet at the completion of the yearly meet to review with the hosting club and review plans with the next club who will be hosting for the next year and to look at who is next in the rotation for following years. The Minuteman club is slated to host the regional meet for 2025.

Many club members have stepped forward and participated in hosting this event in the past. It is a large undertaking and requires planning at least two years ahead of the time to secure a host hotel and line up volunteers to handle all the tasks involved to make the meet a success. Proceeds from this event allow clubs to donate to worthy charities, sponsor youth education programs, offset club expenses and continued interest in the Model A Ford.




Club election of officers needs to is scheduled for the next meeting. We still need a volunteer for President. Please think about volunteering.
