OCTOBER 1988 35 YEARS AGO

Plans were set for our Holiday Party - December 8th at the Weston Golf Club. The menu: NY Sirloin or Baked Scrod, your choice, each for only \$20.00. The 1988 MAFCA National Convention in Sturbridge, MA was a great success! A check from the Sturbridge Committee was presented to our Secretary, Phil Iorio, for \$5,000.00! There was a big push for our membership to bring items in for our annual Auction on November 1st.

OCTOBER 1998 25 YEARS AGO

Our 1998 "Super Tour" took place from July 18th to the 26th and travelled through all of Vermont and into the Adirondack area of New York. The membership unanimously voted to increase 1999 Dues to \$20. It was announced that Dick Stitt was a candidate for election to the Board of Directors for MAFCA this year. Doug Linden announced that the Governor had signed Bill #4785 concerning implementation of Comprehensive and Collision Insurance Coverage on all Antique cars. No details were given as to when the new rates would go into effect.

Waltham Inventor F.W. Davis

Had it not been for a certain chap named Francis W Davis, those of us who drive might have had arms as large as the Hulk's by now. That we don't is thanks to the mechanical engineer who invented power steering all those years ago. Cars had been steadily getting bigger and heavier and turning the wheel required a considerable amount of effort. Enter F. W. Davis and



power steering and they called in Hydraguide.

his hydraulically powered unit, developed almost a century ago.

Francis W. Davis, an engineer of the truck division of Pierce-Arrow, began exploring how steering could be made easier. "The idea of power steering gnawed at me when I was working on those heavy-duty trucks at Pierce-Arrow," he once said. "They were getting larger and more cumbersome and harder to steer. So were passenger vehicles. I knew some mechanical steering aid would have to he developed."

He left Pierce Arrow after five years and moved to Waltham, Mass., to start his own shop with George Jessup. The problem was that the existing pressurized hydraulic systems needed large storage tanks of pressurized oil. After much work miniaturizing the pressurized systems, he was able to demonstrated the first practical power steering system in 1926 by driving his Pierce Arrow from New York to Los Angeles in 12 days. The war slowed things but Davis worked with both GM and Chrysler over the years and the Chrysler Imperial was the 1st company to produce cars that had the
