





The need to remove the dipper tray in the oil pan comes up occasionally so I thought this Tech Tip would be good to know the next time you need to separate the two. Looks like it makes removal easy.

Cleaning Your Engine Oil Pan

March seems like a great time to get the Model A up on jack stands so you can crawl under and get the old oil pan off to clean out the sludge and look at the rods and mains. Don't do it yet if you think you can't get it done before the OCMAFC Pancake Breakfast! Hold off until at least after the breakfast, we want you and your Model A there.



Recently at club member John Carter's home in Yorba Linda we pulled the engine out of his 1929 CCPU, closed cab pickup, and mounted it to his engine stand to disassemble for an evaluation. It was great to have a lot of members jump in and help. This is not an original idea of mine so I'm not taking credit for it, but I thought it was such a great simple idea that I just had to mention it. Most of us know you just can't get the inside of a Model A oil pan clean without removing the dipper tray. Beings Model A's are about the easiest car or truck to work on, this has to be one of the better ideas for getting this job done. Simply get a block of wood, long enough to go across the rails, resting on top about the middle, place



a clamp down in the hole where the oil pump goes in and the other end of the clamp on top of the board. The tray pops right out. There are sharp edges on the tray with the baffles on the underside, be careful. Before you snap the tray back in make sure all of the old gasket material is cleaned from the surface and the lip of the tray fits properly on both sides.




Our September meeting will be back at the Church, we look forward to seeing you there.
